The Heritage Society is looking for a people person who will work as an independent contractor to support the Heritage Society and its mission, an individual who cares about members, and whose goal is to help the society continue thriving and growing in 2024 and beyond.

The administrator is paid a flat rate of \$500 a month, with the understanding that accomplishing tasks will take 25 hours or fewer per month. Responsibilities include organizing meetings, maintaining the master membership list, assisting the Registrar with item inventory, promoting the organization to the public and on social media, processing mail, email and phone calls to the organization, and communicating with City of Irving staff regarding the Heritage House, meeting locations, and special events.
